Today's Readings

Third Sunday after Pentecost

The Collect of the Day

Keep, O Lord, your household the Church in your steadfast faith and love, that through your grace we may proclaim your truth with boldness, and minister your justice with compassion; for the sake of our Savior Jesus Christ, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. *Amen.*

First Reading Genesis 18:1-15

The Lord appeared to Abraham by the oaks of Mamre, as he sat at the entrance of his tent in the heat of the day. He looked up and saw three men standing near him. When he saw them, he ran from the tent entrance to meet them, and bowed down to the ground. He said,

‘My lord, if I find favour with you, do not pass by your servant. Let a little water be brought, and wash your feet, and rest yourselves under the tree. Let me bring a little bread, that you may refresh yourselves, and after that you may pass on—since you have come to your servant.’

So they said, ‘Do as you have said.’

And Abraham hastened into the tent to Sarah, and said, ‘Make ready quickly three measures of choice flour, knead it, and make cakes.’

Abraham ran to the herd, and took a calf,

tender and good, and gave it to the servant, who hastened to prepare it. Then he took curds and milk and the calf that he had prepared, and set it before them; and he stood by them under the tree while they ate. They said to him, ‘Where is your wife Sarah?’

And he said, ‘There, in the tent.’ Then one said, ‘I will surely return to you in due season, and your wife Sarah shall have a son.’

And Sarah was listening at the tent entrance behind him. Now Abraham and Sarah were old, advanced in age; it had ceased to be with Sarah after the manner of women. So Sarah laughed to herself, saying, ‘After I have grown old, and my husband is old, shall I have pleasure?’

The Lord said to Abraham, ‘Why did Sarah laugh, and say, “Shall I indeed bear a child, now that I am old?” Is anything too wonderful for the Lord? At the set time I will return to you, in due season, and Sarah shall have a son.’

But Sarah denied, saying, ‘I did not laugh; for she was afraid. He said, ‘Oh yes, you did laugh.’

Second Reading Romans 5:1-8

Therefore, since we are justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have obtained access to this grace in which we stand; and we boast in our hope of sharing the glory of God. And not only that, but we also boast in our sufferings, knowing that suffering produces endurance, and endurance produces character, and character produces hope, and hope does not disappoint us, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us. For while we were still weak, at the right time Christ died for the ungodly. Indeed, rarely will anyone die for a righteous person—though perhaps for a good person someone might actually dare to die. But God proves his love for us in that while we still were sinners Christ died for us.

Gospel Reading Matthew 9:35–10:8

Jesus went about all the cities and villages, teaching in their synagogues, and proclaiming the good news of the kingdom, and curing every disease and every sickness. When he saw the crowds, he had compassion for them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd. Then he said to his disciples, 'The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few; therefore ask the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest.'

Then Jesus summoned his twelve disciples and gave them authority over unclean spirits, to cast them out, and to cure every disease and every sickness. These are the names of the twelve apostles: first, Simon, also known as Peter, and his brother Andrew; James son of Zebedee, and his brother John; Philip and Bartholomew; Thomas and Matthew the tax-collector; James son of Alphaeus, and Thaddaeus; Simon the Cananaean, and Judas Iscariot, the one who betrayed him. These twelve Jesus sent out with the following instructions: 'Go nowhere among the Gentiles, and enter no town of the Samaritans, but go rather to the lost sheep of the house of Israel. As you go, proclaim the good news, "The kingdom of heaven has come near." Cure the sick, raise the dead, cleanse the lepers, cast out demons. You received without payment; give without payment.

The Vocation of Discipleship

In the midst of our busy lives it can be difficult to hear God's call. Laundry piles up, friends and children need tending to, work is demanding. How do we know what God is calling us to? What does it mean to be a follower of God's call in our life given these worldly demands? What is the relationship between God's call to salvation and to faithfulness in our daily lives?

Over the summer, we will be asking these questions by consulting three sources of God's call in our lives: scripture, sacrament, and saints. We'll start by looking to scripture for stories of conversion of life. Scripture is full of rich, ambiguous characters who, in their ambiguity, make it possible for us to imagine ourselves being called by God into new life. Such callings are often not easy, but these stories of conversion reveal the joy and fullness of life that comes with responding to God's call. Next we'll take up the sacraments as means of grace. The sacraments, like the stories of conversion in scripture, are formative and reveal God's call for us. We'll take up Baptism, Eucharist, and Reconciliation as three formative practices that invite us into the vocation of discipleship. Finally, we'll look at the strange and (extra) ordinary lives of some of the saints who populate our liturgical calendar. We'll ask, who are these people? And in asking we'll look for the ways that God called them into lives of discipleship.

Second Quarter Care & Share:

The Food Bank of Northern Indiana

In May 1993, United Religious Community of St. Joseph County's Hunger Education Task Force accepted the challenge of reestablishing food banking services in north central Indiana. Our first distribution of 6,800 pounds was made in December 1993 to 29 agencies. As our member agencies and donor base grew, we became self-sufficient and large enough to be considered for national certification. In 2006, our organization's name was changed to the Food Bank of Northern Indiana serving Elkhart, LaPorte, Kosciusko, Marshall, Starke and St. Joseph Counties. In 2016, the Food Bank of Northern Indiana distributed nearly 7 million pounds of food to our network of 200 member agencies in our six-county service area.

Today, 14% of northern Indiana residents are food insecure; they don't know when they will eat their next meal. This epidemic is silent. When all residents have food security and access to nutritious foods, we will be even better physically and mentally prepared to take on life's challenges.

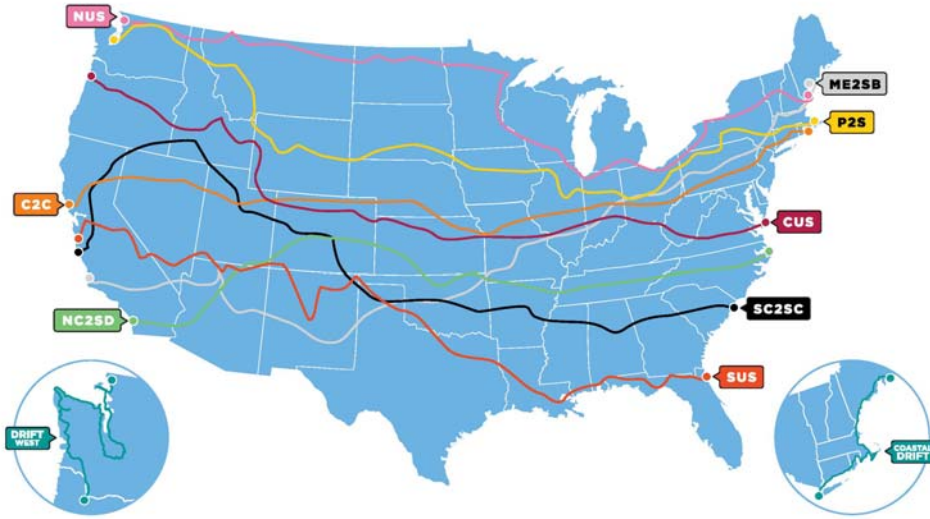

Thirty-six bicyclists set out yesterday from Portsmouth, New Hampshire, on a cross country ride with the Bike & Build organization. They will stop at several places along the way for a “build day” whereon they will work with local organizations to construct or renovate affordable housing.

The Northern US route will once again bring the group to South Bend. The Cathedral community has offered our facilities and hospitality to Bike & Build riders for many years, and we are pleased to do so again in 2017. Riders will arrive after a 70 mile ride from Kalamazoo on the afternoon of Monday, July 10. They have a build day in South Bend on July 11, before rising early for a 45 mile hop to Michigan City on July 12.

As in years past, we need volunteers to welcome the group, provide and/or prepare food for several meals, drive the group to their worksite (if necessary—it’s pretty close by this year), and drive to whatever recreational opportunity we come up with (the South Bend Cubs are away until Wednesday of that week. Bummer). Sign-up sheets are on the table at the back of the Church.
